Our 'From the Heart' theme will accumulate in a visual art piece involving each student painting a small tile which will be put together to make a larger legacy piece. We look forward to seeing this come together over the next month or so and sharing this with you as we approach the end of this school year.

Students Entering Grade 8




Delivering Lunches



Student Absences

If we do not hear from you, we will call home to ensure your child's safety.

Student Late Arrivals

If your child arrives to school late, please ensure to do the daily health-check for your child then take your child to the outside door of their classroom and knock. Please wait with your child and phone the main office at 604-296-9010 to let the office know they have arrived. – Thank you
