#### Principal's Message



Dear Parents,

Welcome to December! I hope this newsletter finds you all well despite managing through the recent wet weather. It has been challenging to say the least. We hope, however, that you are continuing to take advantage of being outside during our COVID times to get fresh, ventilated air and to keep active. Many of our classes continue to take students outside to carry out their curriculum studies. Classes continue to enjoy exploring in the forest areas and are learning to manage the wet and windy days like true explorers!

Our staff are currently preparing a 'Snapshot of Learning' for parents as a means of reporting for this term. These 'Snapshots' (an informal report) will provide updated information on the growth and development of your child's academic, social and emotional skills. The 'Snapshot' will only be specific in the areas of Language Arts and Math. Other subjects will not be specifically mentioned although general comments on your child as a learner including comments on work habits, student engagement and behaviour will be made. Some teachers will also accompany this 'Snapshot' with an electronic or binder portfolio, teacher blog or 'Freshgrade' posts, and these additions will share specific examples of this term's work.



If you need to create an account, contact any Burnaby recreation centre or cultural facility. To browse programs:

- Visit Burnaby.ca/Active, and select the age group you're interested in.
- Use the "Complex" filter in the top right to search programs by location.
- Click on the "show courses" button of the program you're interested in to see all the details.


#### **TIPS & TRICKS**

- » You can also search for programs under Advance Search.
- » Enter a description under "Containing Keyword". Examples of keywords are "swim," "yoga", "dance" and "painting".
- » You can also filter results by selecting dates and days of the week.
- » Once you find programs you're interested in, note the program name so that you can find it easily again when registration opens early December.

#### HOW TO REGISTER ONLINE

It's easy. If you need to create an account, contact any Burnaby recreation, arts or cultural facility.

- 1. Find the course you want to register for.
- Select the course you want and click "Add".
- Login with your client number and family PIN.
- Click on "Go to Checkout", and pay for your course.
- If you want a receipt emailed to you, click on "My Account" at the top right of the page and click "Thank You" (under "Current / Future Registrations").
