



How?

- ⇒ Fill up a clear plastic bag with your empties, take it to any Burnaby
 - Return-It Express Depot
- ⇒ Print a label for each bag at their kiosks by entering the school's old fax number: 604-664-8668, and then leave your bag in the designated Express dropoff area to be counted by the depot
- ⇒ Make sure empties are not crushed because the depots need to scan the barcode/label on the containers.


