- o Recap of asks:
 - 1) Projector in library projects everything green and are not fixable
 - 2) New level reading sets follow the science of reading model that confederation park continues to implement; sets is made in Canada - a combination of non-fiction and fiction, plus aligns with how we are looking to teach reading. We currently have one set, but getting more sets will help the teachers
- Newsletter update:
 - Goal for publishing on website: Drive people to use website as a communication tool. More timely communication. PAC will send newsletters plus post on website.
 - o Information can also be posted on the community tab
- Memory book: looking for volunteers for each division. Nancy will be the contact person
 - o Derek (photographer) will help us, as long as we have templates to do everything.
 - o Previous order amount was about \$25
 - o We could also have local business sponsor ads within memory book to help fund.
 - o 2018/2019: \$2200 cost; \$3000 revenue → 100 books (approx.) for a profit of \$800
- Christmas pancake breakfast: Dec 21st last day of school is Thursday.
- Similar to last year we will again find a vendor to cook the pancakes and will need parent volunteers

to serve the pancakes (only need gluten free ones made by parent volunteers)

- o PAC executive working on quotes for pancake breakfast (3-4 pancakes per kid pending size)
- o Volunteers to cook gluten free at home.
- o Hot chocolate (Shaen to provide dispenser)
- o Follow-up with restaurants: we provide the container for pancake, they sterilize and then fill their pancakes
- Movie night: December is very busy and we have a lot of fundraisers wrapping up so we would like to suggest moving the 1st movie night to the new year.
 - o Boomerang Club will help dispense/sell popcorn
 - o \$584 movie license cost, to share with school
 - o Family Dinner & Movie night at school (5:30-6:00pm start time), Friday, February 2nd, 2023.
 - o We will provide them with a narrowed down list for kids to vote.

 - o Deadline is 29th to get orders for Christmas break.
 - o Jacqueline to provide flyers for teachers to put on their window.
